Food Safety and Hygiene

Royal Environmental Hygiene Institute of Scotland (REHIS) Food Safety and Hygiene Certification

The General Trustees have had to temporarily suspended the complimentary REHIS Food safety and Hygiene training. This is as a result of staff changes and the need for a REHIS accredited trainer to oversee and administer the training, marking and issuing of certificates.

We are aware that an increasing number of congregations are keen to take advantage of the free training opportunity and we are working closely with REHIS and other approved training consultants to identify a workable solution.

Following a face-to-face meeting with the REHIS last month, we are following up on their recommendations as to how we could deliver training and certification.

If you have already registered for the training, please do not attempt to re-register as we will contact you as soon as the service has been reinstated.

If you are planning to register for the training but have not already done so, please continue to register your interest by contacting safebuildings@churchofscotland.org.uk via email. We will contact you as soon as we are able to re-commence the training.

Requirement for training

Congregations are not required to undertake the certified training if they only offer occasional teas, coffees and supply low risk foods such as pre-packed biscuits and cakes, etc.

However, if your congregation is preparing soups, sandwiches, hot filled rolls or providing a community café, soup kitchen or food outlet for the community, this may be classed as a higher risk commercial activity. In addition to the certified REHIS Food Safety and Hygiene certification, you should contact your Local Authority to notify them of the catering that is being offered by your congregation.

Certificates

If you have already undergone the REHIS training and are still awaiting your certification, please contact us at safebuildings@churchofscotland.org.uk quoting your name, congregation and home address. Your REHIS certification will then be forwarded to you.
